

# About Us

Established in 1967, Wasatch Behavioral Health “WBH” is a public comprehensive behavioral health center providing a variety of services designed to meet the needs of children, youth, adults and their families throughout Utah and Wasatch Counties.

WBH is staffed by licensed professionals who specialize in mental health and substance use recovery. These professionals include psychiatrists, APRNs, nurses, clinical psychologists, marriage and family therapists, clinical social workers, clinical mental health and substance use counselors, adult and youth case managers, residential services staff, peer support specialists, family resource facilitators, parent mentors, care team assistants and a comprehensive administrative business staff.

WBH Buildings are accessible to those with physical disabilities including offices, exam rooms, and equipment. Access to interpreter services for all languages, including American Sign Language, are available to Medicaid Clients.

WBH accepts most insurance plans including Medicaid and Medicare. We also provide language translation and interpreter services for individuals and families.

## **988 SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE**

Call or Text 988. The three-digit dialing code will route callers to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline.

Provides 24-hour a day crisis and emergency services to all age groups. Crisis services are provided over the telephone, mobile outreach and walk-ins.

## **CRISIS RECEIVING AND OUTREACH CENTER**

**1175 E 300 N, Provo, UT 801-852-2131**

Provides short-term (under 23 hours) observation and crisis stabilization services to all referrals in a home-like, non-hospital environment. Referrals are welcome from law enforcement, Community partners, Religious organizations, families, hospitals and others. The primary goal is to help de-escalate and provide resources and support for individuals in crisis or needing other immediate support.

## **CRISIS RESIDENTIAL SUPPORT**

The Crisis Residential Support unit is an additional line of stabilization for those who may have more acute crisis needs. This allows for additional evaluation, collaboration and monitoring up to an additional week past the initial 23-hour initial stay at the Receiving and Outreach Center.

## **INPATIENT SERVICES**

Provides hospital services in Utah County at Utah Valley Hospital (Provo, UT), Mountain View Hospital (Payson, UT), Provo Canyon Behavioral Hospital (Orem, UT) and other Utah hospitals as needed to Medicaid enrollees.

## **Mental Health and Substance Use Services for Adults**

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### **OUTPATIENT TREATMENT SERVICES**

Services start with an initial intake assessment appointment. After the assessment, the clinician will discuss services that will best meet your needs.

### **CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES**

Case Management services assists individuals and families to:

- Maintain housing,
- Develop service plans,
- Ensure effective coordination of mental health and/or substance use services,

- assist in addressing unmet needs and collaborate and coordinate with other to ensure service effectiveness.

### **INTENSIVE RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT SERVICES**

**2877 West Center Street, Provo, UT 801-852-3320**

A short-term adult residential treatment program designed to help individuals who suffer from chronic mental illness by providing resources, services and opportunities as an alternative to hospitalization. Programs and support services include assessment, individual therapy, skill development, case management services and psychopharmacology. A prescriber makes rounds weekly and is available on-call 24 hours a day.

### **JUSTICE REINVESTMENT INITIATIVE (JRI) PROGRAM**

Provides appropriate aftercare planning and services for individuals after they have been released from jail to help increase their chances of successful independent living, thereby preventing their swift return to jail, homelessness or hospital emergency rooms. A typical plan includes individual and group therapy, medication management, educational services, employment training and housing placement.

### **ADULT JAIL SERVICES**

Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Services provided at the Utah County Jail include:

- Mental health program focusing on inmates identified as needing mental health services while in custody. The goal of these services is to ensure the mentally ill inmate's stability while incarcerated and to prevent deterioration that might lead to harming himself/herself or others.

- **UTAH COUNTY JAIL OUT (On-Unit Treatment) PROGRAM** - Program combines substance use intervention with counseling for criminal thinking and behavior. Inmates of the security center may participate voluntarily or may be court ordered. There are separate tracks for both male and female.

## **SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES**

Provides a range of prevention and recovery services including detoxification, residential and outpatient services, case management services for individuals under Court supervision and drug testing for individuals enrolled in programs.

## **ACCESS TO RECOVERY**

Designed to provide eligible clients with a choice of services and community service providers to assist them in initiating and/or maintaining recovery.

## **FOOTHILL RESIDENTIAL**

A residential facility that offers co-ed treatment, as well as separate gender groups, to address their unique treatment needs. Detoxification treatment and self-help groups are provided in a live-in, safe environment. **For more information, call 385-268-5070.**

## **MEDICATION ASSISTANT TREATMENT (MAT)**

Provides medication-assisted treatment (MAT) to treat substance use disorder as well as sustain recovery and prevent overdose. MAT is primarily used for the treatment of addiction. The prescribed medication operates to

normalize brain chemistry, block the euphoric effects of alcohol and opioids, relieve physiological cravings and normalize body functions without the negative and euphoric effects of the substance used.

### **PROMISE PROGRAM**

The Promise Program is designed to treat woman who have a substance use disorder. The Promise Program addresses specific needs such as childcare, primary healthcare, transportation, housing, education, and employment, along with gender-specific treatment. This allows the mother to recover from substance use disorder while learning the skills needed to stay abstinent while providing a safe and stable situation for the children. **For more information, call 385-268-5080.**

### **GENERAL AND INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT SUBSTANCE USE SERVICES**

Day Treatment is from 9am-12pm

Night Treatment is from 6pm-9pm

Services include individual and group therapies, skills development, and case management services for practical problems of sober living. Recovery Management is also available. General outpatient treatment is 1 to 8 hours per week. Intensive Outpatient treatment is 9-20 hours per week. **For more information, call 385-268-5000.**

### **WASATCH ASSISTANCE TEAM COUNSELING THE HOMELESS (WATCH)**

Provides individual therapy, medication management and case management services to adults who are chronically mentally ill, homeless and do not have traditional Medicaid, private insurance or SSI/SSA benefits.

## **WASATCH HOUSE**

Wasatch House provides a unique, strengths-based program for individuals with a mental health challenge who want to regain their vocational and social skills and enhance their overall mental and physical well-being. Members of the Clubhouse work side by side with staff in taking responsibility for various programs on-site including; food services, clerical, financial, thrift store, building and grounds, computer/data entry, and community education.

## **SUPPORTED HOUSING SERVICES**

WBH operates programs designed to provide community-based care for the seriously mentally ill who are in need of transitional living arrangements to help them obtain the goal of independent living. **For information about housing options, call 801-373-7443.**

## **PEER SUPPORT SERVICES**

A certified peer mentor helps individuals identify their social support systems that will help them to know that they are not alone while they are making the changes in recovery. Peer support services includes support groups, educational actives and recovery resource connecting.
