SERVICES for CHILDREN, YOUTH and ADULTS

CRISIS/EMERGENCY SERVICES RECOVERY OUTREACH CENTER 801-373-7393, toll-free at 866-366-7987 1175 E 300 N, Provo, UT

Provides 24-hour a day crisis and emergency services to all age groups. Crisis services are provided over the telephone and through face-to-face assessments.

INPATIENT SERVICES

Wasatch Mental Health provides hospital services in Utah County at Utah Valley Regional Medical Center (Provo, UT), Mountain View Hospital (Payson, UT), Provo Canyon Behavioral Hospital (Orem, UT) and other Utah hospitals as needed to Medicaid enrollees.

PREP TEAM

Prevention and Recovery for Early Psychosis 1165 E 300 N, Provo, UT, 801-377-1213

Provides early intervention services for youth and young adults experiencing first episode psychosis. Services include individual therapy, family psychoeducation and support, supported employment and education, medication management and case management services.

Provides psychological and neuropsychological testing to assist in the process of diagnosis and treatment planning.

SERVICES for FAMILIES

Wasatch Mental Health provides outpatient services designed to meet the needs of children, youth, adults and their families. For admission information, see “**Service Locations**” and call the clinic nearest your home.

Established in 1967, Wasatch Mental Health is a public comprehensive mental health center providing a variety of services to the Utah and Wasatch County communities.

Wasatch Mental Health is staffed by licensed mental health professionals who specialize in mental health recovery. These professionals include psychiatrists, APRNs, nurses, clinical psychologists, marriage and family therapists, clinical social workers, clinical mental health counselors, adult and youth case managers, residential services staff, peer support specialists, family resource facilitators, parent mentors, care team assistants and a comprehensive administrative business staff.

SERVICES for ADULTS

INTENSIVE RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT SERVICES

1157 E 300 N, Provo, UT, 801-377-4668

An adult residential treatment program designed to help individuals who suffer from chronic mental illness by providing resources, services and opportunities as an alternative to hospitalization. Programs and support services include assessment, individual therapy, skill development, case management services and psychopharmacology. A prescriber makes rounds weekly and is available on-call 24 hours a day.

JUSTICE REINVESTMENT INITIATIVE (JRI) PROGRAM

Provides appropriate aftercare planning and services for individuals after they have been released from jail to help increase their chances of successful independent living, thereby preventing their swift return to jail, homelessness or hospital emergency rooms. A typical plan includes individual and group therapy, medication management, educational services, employment training and housing placement.

UTAH COUNTY JAIL SERVICES

Provides the jail with therapists and prescribers who conduct mental health clinics and consultation services. The goal of these services is to ensure the mentally ill inmate's stability while incarcerated and to prevent deterioration that might lead to harming himself/herself or others.

WASATCH ASSISTANCE TEAM COUNSELING THE HOMELESS (WATCH)

Provides individual therapy, medication management and case management services to adults who are chronically mentally ill, homeless and do not have traditional Medicaid, private insurance or SSI/SSA benefits.

WASATCH HOUSE

605 E 600 S, Provo, UT, 801-373-7440

Provides a strengths-based approach where treatment, vocational training and support are provided to individuals to regain their social skills, vocational skills and maintain psychiatric stability. Members work closely with staff in taking responsibility for various programs on-site including: food services, clerical, financial, thrift store, building and grounds and computer/data entry to improve their social and employment skills.

ASPIRE

A residential treatment program for female youth, ages 12 to 18 who are in DCFS custody.

GIANT STEPS – AUTISM

Classrooms located in Orem, Provo and Saratoga Springs. Office: Foothill Elementary School, Orem, UT, 801-226-5437

Provides intensive treatment for children ages 3 to 5 who have been diagnosed with an Autism Spectrum Disorder.

The program also provides additional services for families to help support, educate, and advocate for their child's needs.

XCEL ADOLESCENT AUTISM

Provides social skills, emotional regulation skills and coping strategies for adolescents with an Autism Spectrum Disorder and teens with developmental delays.

Provides 24-hour a day, 7 days a week immediate crisis and mental health services for male and female youth ages 10 to 17 who are vulnerable of becoming runaways or experiencing serious parent-child conflicts.

Shelter Care: Provides temporary placement for youth in DCFS custody due to abuse or neglect and/or who have had a disruption in a foster care placement.
